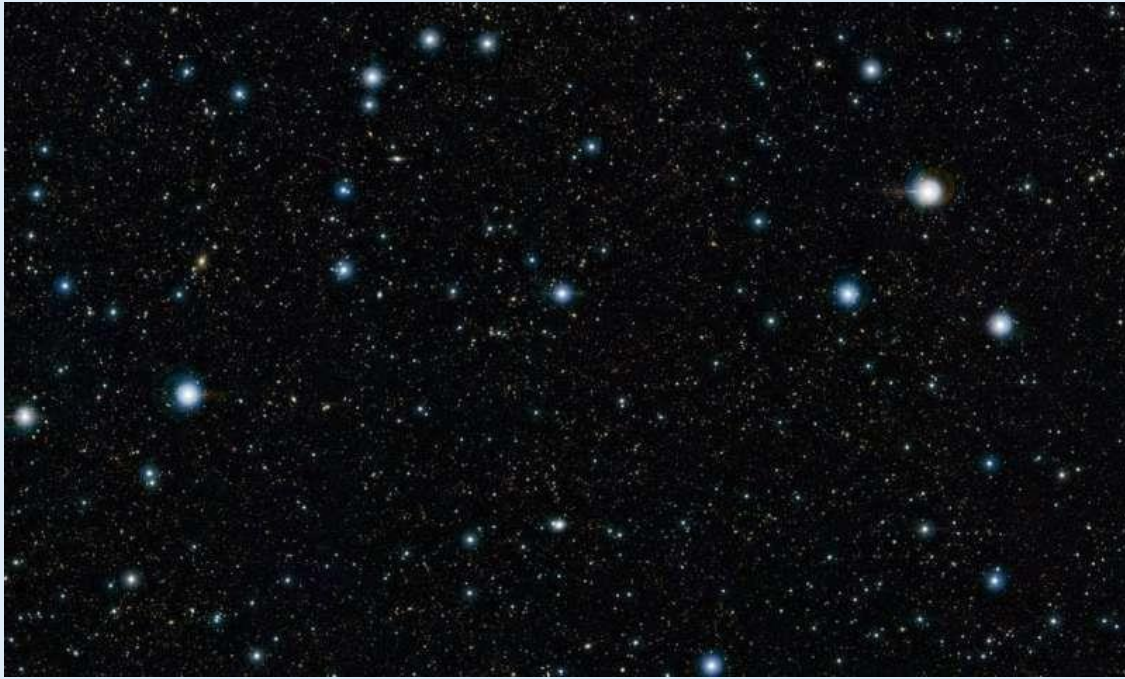
Scandinavian Robins

These people are called refugees.
