

Home Learning —Year 1- TERMS 5 & 6

Our enquiry question is 'How important has transport been to Bristol?'

We would like your child to complete all of the essential activities in the box.

You could then complete some of the other suggested activities or think of your own linked to our learning. We would love to see your learning on Seesaw.

SUGGESTED ACTIVITES:

- Go for a walk or take a ride on the bus somewhere new in Bristol. Can you write about your journey or make a map to show where you travelled?
- Interview a member of your family who is older than you. Can they tell you about the first car in their family? Can they describe how they would normally travel to different places as child? What types of transport did they use?
- Junk model or draw your own type of transport.
- Make a car for your teddy out of junk materials. Decide what size of box you need to choose for your bear to fit comfortably into!
- Record the methods of transport you can use to get to school from your house, and how many minutes it takes.
- Stand outside your house, and over a 5-minute period, count how many cars go past.
- Learn The Wheels on the Bus' in another language.
- Draw a map of your favourite place! This could be a park, holiday, a city etc.
- Can you make a ramp for a car to travel down or a bridge for a vehicle to travel over just like 'The Clifton Suspension Bridge?'

ESSENTIAL

- Read each day (x 5 at least per week)
- Complete the phonics homework set each week.
- Practice your handwriting (e.g. writing lists, stories, cards, letters, notes).
- Practice forming your numbers correctly.
